- 1914
  - World War I begins in Europe.
  - Archduke Franz Ferdinand assassinated in Sarajevo. A black-and-white photograph of Archduke Franz Ferdinand is shown.

- 1928: Herbert Hoover elected president.

  - Holocaust of Jews, others carried out by Nazi Germans in concentration camps begins.
  - U.S. begins to provide military aid to Britain under the Lend-Lease Act.
  - Japanese planes bomb U.S. naval base at Pearl Harbor in Hawaii.
- 1942
  - Fair Employment Practices Committee created.
  - U.S. Navy defeats Japanese forces at Midway, a turning point in the war.
  - U.S. begins internment of Japanese Americans.
- 1942.

- Winston Churchill, Franklin Roosevelt, and Joseph Stalin meet in Tehran to discuss Allied war priorities.
- U.S. troops invade Italy.
- 1944: Allied forces land at Normandy in France as part of D-Day invasion.
- 1945:
  - Battles of Iwo Jima and Okinawa are waged against Japanese forces.
  - U.S. drops atomic bombs on Japan.
  - World War II ends with surrender of Axis powers.
  - Surviving Holocaust victims are freed.
  - Winston Churchill, Franklin Roosevelt, and Joseph Stalin meet in Yalta to discuss postwar world.
- 1946: George Kennan sends Long Telegram from Moscow. An image shows a telegram.
